Karma Jamtsho (Mr) is a PhD scholar at Edith Cowan University in Australia, investigating impacts of impervious surfaces on the urban riparian zone along the Thimphu River. By analyzing the structural composition of vegetation, and microbial communities, the study aims to identify the affects impervious surfaces on urban riparian ecosystems. In addition to his current research, Karma has conducted research on alpine vascular plant diversity and distribution to understand anthropogenic affects on alpine plant communities along the Jomokungkhar trail of Sakteng Wildlife Sanctuary in Bhutan. Karma earned his Master's degree in botany from Prince of Songkla University of Thailand in 2013. He also worked a science educator under the Ministry of Education of the Royal Government of Bhutan. As an educator, he authored two chapters for the Environmental Science textbook for classes 11 and 12, published by the Royal Education Council of Bhutan.
